IdentAlloy: Building the Foundation for the Future

The IdentAlloy/IdentCeram program allows participating manufacturers and suppliers a way to verify the content of restorative materials by providing certificates that attest to the material's type, source, and composition. Manufacturers become licensees under the IdentAlloy/IdentCeram program by conforming to rigid requirements for compliance with material specifications. IdentAlloy/IdentCeram certificates are provided from participating manufacturers to dental labs with their alloy or ceramic material orders. Labs include these certificates with every case sent to dentists to verify the content of the materials used. Dentists may then assure patients that appropriate material is being employed, while adding the certificates to the patient's permanent record.
